## **Dakota Dunes River Update 9**

The Missouri and Big Sioux Rivers were at elevations of 1085.28 (24.9 foot river stage at Sioux City) and 1086.19 (32.3 foot river stage at North Sioux City) respectively at 7:30 this morning.

This represents a drop of over of foot from last night at 6:30 pm. At this time, it is safe to remove you floor drain plugs.

We are getting information of another surge of water in the Big Sioux from snowmelt north of Sioux Falls to arrive around April 1. You may have seen a press release from Governor Noem's Office regarding this. We are in the process of evaluating these impacts on Dakota Dunes.

According to the National Weather Service website, the event that just finished was within .3 of the record on the Big Sioux with a flow of approximately 63,000 cfs. The record rivers stage was 37.7 feet in 2014 and the peak river stage for this event was 37.42. The Missouri River was a peak flow of 122,000 according to the National Weather site. We will communicate expected impacts of this event as it becomes available.

We appreciate all of your cooperation during this event. Another update should come out this afternoon.
