Dakota Dunes River Update 13

According to the National Weather Service the Big Sioux River at North Sioux City was at a river stage of 27.24 feet at 3:30 today. It appears the Big Sioux River will crest lower than the 30.6 feet indicated in the last update. This should occur later this week. The Corps will be increasing releases from Gavin's Point dam over the coming days to help manage runoff inflows into the main stem Dams up river. This morning the releases were increased from 24,000 to 27,000 cfs; Tuesday morning releases will go to 30,000 cfs; Wednesday morning to 33,000 cfs and Thursday morning to 36,000 cfs. With what is projected to come out of the James River, Vermillion River and the Big Sioux River, we do not anticipate any issues but will keep our preventive measures in place for the short term as those release numbers are subject to change. Our next update will be Wednesday evening.
